ARTS EDUCATION WITH MISS LLOYD

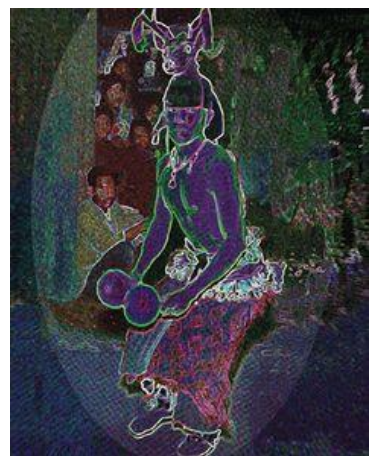
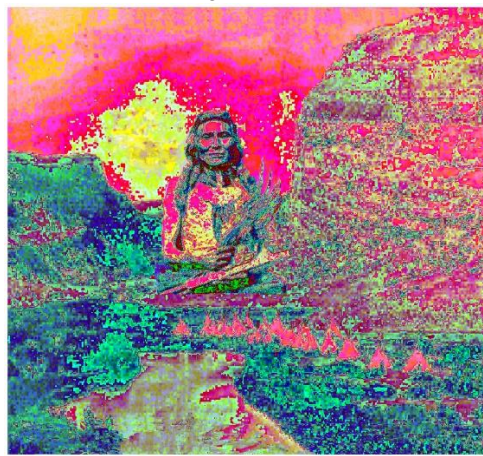

2. She includes First Nations culture in her artwork (just like in her music!)

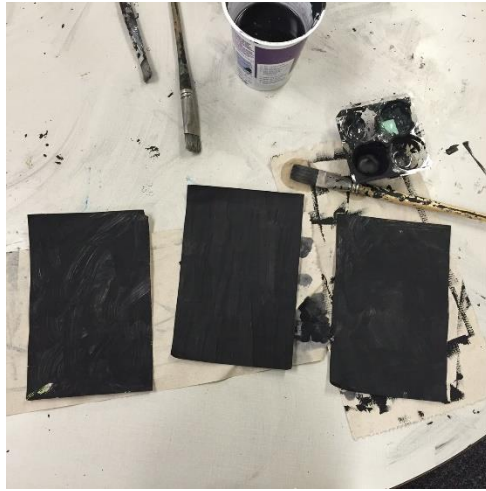


OUR ARTWORK

First, we used Buffy Sainte-Marie's idea of using lots of colour by filling our pages with as much crayon as possible:



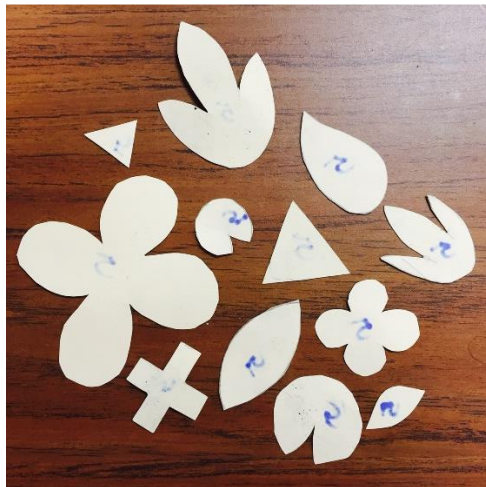
Then we painted over the entire page with black acrylic paint:
